### One Family Fund hosts festive fundraiser at Xtreme Karting

The nonprofit organization One Family Fund hosts events that are normally somber parlor meetings where a wounded soldier or child-abuse victim from Israel shares his or her story.

But on Nov. 18, One Family Fund organized a very different event, with its first Xtreme Dream Race Night, a adults-only fundraiser at Xtreme Indoor Karting in Fort Lauderdale, which included a silent auction, racing and music.

All proceeds went directly to help Israel's orphaned, injured and bereaved terror victims.

The organization aimed for a fun fundraiser that would help the cause.

"We wanted, for a change, to have fun in honor of survivors, families, because every time something like that happens, we need to move on and life continues," said Anat Ichak, assistant director for One Family

One Family Fund board members estimated that about 230 people attended, and the event has made more money than the expected through the auction, donors, sponsors, contributions and raffle.

"We're very happy and thrilled it was a fun night and the phone has been ringing with people telling us they had a good time," said Lisa Miller Schwartz, a board member for One Family Fund.

Dr. Robert Ennis, co-

president for One Family Fund, said the evening also helped raise awareness of terror victims in Israel.
